Organization Overview

Mission

TF's mission is to preserve and perpetuate the Tebughna Dena'ina Athabascan traditions.

Background

TF was founded in 2007 and serves the Native Village of Tyonek, a tribal community in rural and remote Alaska. TF's solar program was initiated in 2023 to realize NVT's renewable energy goals.



Project Overview

Three tribally-owned community solar arrays are slated for development.

- 1. Tribal Center: 25 kW, located in Tyonek, AK
- 2. Solar Farm: 1.2 MW, located in Tyonek, AK
- 3. Kaloa Buildings: 300 kW, located in Anchorage, AK

Meaningful Benefits

TF's solar programs will provide the following top five benefits:

- Greater Household Savings: Currently, monthly electricity bills are hundreds or thousands of dollars for Tyonek residents. Community solar will result in lower electrical bills.
- 2. Low-to Moderate-Income (LMI) Household Access:

 Community solar will allow for LMI and Alaska Native households to take part in the renewable energy transition.
- 3. Increased Resilience, Preparation, and Grid Benefits:

 Community solar would improve the resilience of the grid in the face of natural disasters and natural gas shortfalls.
- 4. Community Ownership and Wealth-Building
 Opportunities: Tribally-owned community solar will generate revenue for the disadvantaged tribal community of Tyonek.
- 5. Equitable Workforce Development: TF's solar program will identify vocational education opportunities to empower the local workforce to work in renewable energy.
