City of Binghamton Industrial Decarbonization

At KLAW Industries, we are addressing our hometown's persistent energy challenge, high embodied carbon materials and industrial decarbonization, by renovating an abandoned facility in Binghamton, located in Upstate New York. 5 letters of support show how this project integrates our community into core decision-making aspects and demonstrates our experience engaging our City's leaders since starting our company in 2019.

- As the birthplace of IBM, Binghamton was once an economically prosperous City. Since IBM's departure in the 1990s, Binghamton has declined, and now 13 of 16 census tracts in city limits are disadvantaged.
- Growing up here, we saw the energy challenge we face with high-embodied carbon materials produced hundreds of miles away from our City in Canada, out of our control.
- We aim to bring our manufacturing base back with clean energy materials production by working with our community leaders who've signed letters of support to produce low-carbon materials, deploy mineralization technologies, and advance sorbent recovery.
- One proposed site for our community stakeholders to choose from during the Phase I Engagement Plan is the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) Region IX Facility, an abandoned stain on Binghamton's northern corridor.
