

 Inconvenience Surrounding Hard Drive Shredding for SMBs & Individuals

On the consumer side, a standard hard drive shredder can cost more than \$50,000, which makes is economically unfeasible for a small to medium business, or an individual to have an in-house shredding machine.

On the service-providers side, serving small businesses (with less than 100 drives to be shredded) through centralized locations or by sending shred trucks (with trailers) to individual sites is costly.

Lack of Transparency Around Handling & Recycling

Sending waste hard drives to recycling/shredding sites pose a risk of drives being resold to third-parties – leading to threat of data breaches.
